

Hebrew Letter and Vowel Chart

Hebrew Letter	Name and Sound of Letter	Hebrew Letter	Name and Sound of Letter or Vowel
א	Aleph – Silent (takes the sound of the vowel under or next to it)	ב	Pay – P (pay has a <u>p</u> imple)
ב	Bet – B (it has a <u>b</u> elly <u>b</u> utton)	כ	Fay – F
כ	Vet - V	ג	Final Fay – F
ג	Gimel - G	צ	Tzadee – TZ
ד	Dalet – D (dalet is <u>d</u> ented)	ז	Final Tzadee – TZ
ה	Hey - H	ק	Kuf – K
ו	Vav - V	ר	Resh – R (resh is <u>r</u> ounded)
ז	Zayin - Z	ש	Shin – SH
ח	<u>H</u> et - <u>H</u>	ׁשׁ	Sin – S (remember: “A sin is never right.” The dot of a sin goes on the left.)
ט	Tet – T (looks like a mem but is open on the top)	ׁתׁ	Tav - T

ׂדׂ	Final <u>H</u> af – <u>H</u> (final letters occur at the end of a word)	ׂאׂ	AH
ׂלׂ	Lamed – L	ׂנׂ	Indicates a syllable break.
ׂמׂ	Mem – M	ׂנׂ	E
ׂםׂ	Final Mem - M	ׂנׂ	EH
ׂנוׂ	Nun - N	ׂנׂ	EH
ׂנוׂ	Final Nun - N	ׂוׂ	O (<u>Oh</u> , look up in the sky!)
